Digital Learning Policy

This week you will see your child bring home the Digital Learning Policy from school. This is something to fill out with your child to acknowledge the safe use of technology at our school. It is also a wonderful time to discuss how to be safe outside of school with technology, in particular social media and gaming platforms. Just because you are a 'friend' on social media or gaming platforms does not mean you are a friend, if you do not know the person face to face, then they are NOT a friend. Friends are people you know and speak with on a regular basis, someone who knows what you look like and has a positive connection with you.

Please complete the Digital Learning Policy questions and have your child/ ren sign it, along with you and return to your child's teacher. All children return this in order to access technology within our school.

Mobile Phones and smart watches

The State Government made a mandate in all state schools in Victoria that mobile phones are not to be kept by children whilst at school. Should your child have a mobile phone they are to be handed in to the office first thing in the morning and picked up at the end of the day. Phones are kept in a safe in the store room, labelled with your child's name. Should a child be found with a mobile phone during school hours then it will be confiscated and parents contacted to collect it. It will not be given back to the child at the end of the day, it will only be given back

Smart watches are becoming more popular. At this time they do not come under the mandated Mobile Phone Policy, it is a decision to be made by School Council. This will be discussed at the meeting next week. If you would like to voice your opinion, please speak with your school council representative.

Teachers have expressed their views, which will be brought forward at the meeting also. As a staff we have agreed, unless for medical reasons, smart watches are also to be handed in at the office. Why, you may ask? Children are still learning about social norms and privacy, sometimes bad decisions are made and photos, videos are taken that are inappropriate and detrimental to the person/people that are videoed. Sadly it has happened at schools across the state and we would not want this to happen at our school. We understand that parents want their children to be safe and to be able to contact someone when they need to, but at school they can contact their parents if needed and you are able to contact them, through the school, if you need to. I will let you know School Council's decision in the next newsletter.

Mobile Phones and Smart watches are great and sometimes great tools to have in the classroom, exceptions can be made, with my permission for students to use these tools during class time with the supervision of a teacher.




Class in Focus Grade 1 M


